Dear Parishioners:

This week we will be celebrating Catholic Schools Week and you are invited to visit our Parish School this Sunday when we will have an Open House from after the 11 AM Mass until 3 PM. We have an excellent elementary school where we can strengthen the faith of our students while educating them in the basics of grammar and reading, math and science and the social sciences. What a perfect combination for promoting the love of God and the love of learning.

You may recall that during Advent, in this space, I shared with you the unveiling at a December 5th assembly of the priests of the Archdiocese, a proposal from the Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning Commission which offered a pastoral plan that will promote the mission of the Church to evangelize and to serve its people. The proposal is to create a new structure called the Pastoral Service Team (PST) to provide pastoral services to our parishes. These Pastoral Service Teams will be groups of priests, deacons, pastoral associates, lay ecclesial ministers, parish pastoral and finance councils who will provide services to multiple parishes. On January 18th, at a meeting of the priests and pastoral associates of the South Region in Hanover, we were offered the groupings of parishes, which the Pastoral Planning Commission proposes as pastoral collaborative. These groupings are proposed so that pastoral staffs, councils and parishioners can discuss them and offer their insights and recommendations to the Planning Commission. So, we have until May 1st to do our consultation homework by considering the advantages, possible problems, etc. of having St. Paul and Resurrection Parishes work together in this new structure of parish servicing. Or do we have a better idea about what parish we possibly could combine with St. Paul's? We are truly in a consultation phase in the process of presenting eventually to Cardinal O'Malley the results of a consultation that has included, thus far, the clergy, pastoral associates, directors of religious education, catholic school principals, business managers and other parish staff. Now we have the opportunity for parishioners to pray and think about our future which is still a way off. The phase in period for such a major restructuring of pastoral services to 127 pastoral service teams for our current 295 parishes will take three to five years to complete. The process of selecting a new pastor for St. Paul Parish, sometime this year, will be the traditional one, that is, the appointment of a new pastor just for St. Paul's and he would certainly have to anticipate that at some point there would be a change in the structure of parish pastoral services. I am very hopeful that working collaboratively with Resurrection Parish or with whatever combination fits best will help achieve the goals of making the local churches welcoming, nourishing, thriving and evangelizing. Working together with a pastoral team I think will re-energize pastoral leadership, which will grow the Church and develop excellence in faith formation for all generations.

Keep us all in your prayers and please share your thoughts on this proposal with me, or any member of our parish staff and with the members of our Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils. God bless you all.
